Pathways Foundation Open Hearts Awards

Pathways Foundation recognized sixteen congregations in the Chicago area and across the United States with Open Hearts Awards grants in 2010.

“Thank you for supporting our efforts to make everyone welcome. Renovating and expanding our aging church offered a marvelous opportunity to make it fully accessible,” said Father Edward Kealey, Ph.D., pastor of St. Sylvester Roman Catholic Church in Medford, New York. The church broke ground on a renovation project this summer. The main entrance was lowered to ground level and a two-stop elevator with extra-large cab to accommodate wheelchairs was installed. The elevator takes parishioners up seven feet to the worship area and down to a

basement meeting room. Father Kealey rejected a recommendation to install a less expensive, limited use lift instead of the full-size elevator. “Everyone deserves truly good and attractive equipment,” said Father Kealey. Accessible washrooms are also part of the renovation plan. Father Kealey announced the \$1,000 grant from Pathways Foundation at the congregation’s celebration of Inclusion Awareness Day on October 10, 2010.

Following a Pathways Foundation seminar for clergy, Father Constantine Botsis, pastor, St. Haralambos Greek Orthodox Church, Niles, IL, began annual Inclusion Awareness Sundays to better educate his parishioners about the need for access to worship. Through a parishioner’s generosity, the porch and sidewalk on the front of the church was replaced with a ramp. The beautifully concealed, heated ramp enhanced the main entrance but was not visible to all. The Open Hearts Award grant will be used to install signage to publicize the ramp and welcome everyone to the church.

Open Hearts Awards (Cont'd.)

Holy Apostles Greek Orthodox Church, Westchester, IL recently installed accessible parking places, curb cuts, an automatic door opener and modified a washroom for accessibility. Their \$1,000 Open Hearts Award grant was used to pave a grassy area adjacent to their accessible parking places. Parishioners who use wheelchairs now have easier access to the sidewalk leading to the church entrance.

Accessible Faith Grants

The Retirement Research Foundation Accessible Faith Grants help Chicago area houses of worship fund accessibility projects. This year the program has expanded to six Chicago counties: Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, and McHenry. Applications are due **March 1 to June 1, 2011**.
